Berwick Parish Church is one of only two churches completed during the government of Oliver Cromwell.

It was built in 1650-52 and is recognised by Pevsner to be “of quite exceptional architectural interest”.

Located a short distance from the town centre, it is on an established tourist circuit and receives many visitors.

A warm welcome is extended to all: those who are interested in the history of the building and those who share the faith of the Church.

The facilities in the church building and in the adjacent modern Parish Centre are much used throughout the year, both for regular worship and for a large variety of local activities.

What do we do?



The Trust supports

the financial objectives of the Parochial Church Council. It is administered by a group of Trustees comprising church members and other local people and is distinct from the Parochial Church Council, the body that runs the affairs and finances of the parish church on a day to day basis. Trustees are advised on investment decisions by external professional consultants and their policy is to pursue an ethical investment strategy aiming for long term growth. Annual accounts are subject to independent examination.

What are our projects?



In the recent past

the Trust has provided funding for church projects, including rebuilding and modernisation of the fine pipe organ, overhaul of the church's external stonework, restoration of the stained-glass windows, replacement and upgrade of the church heating plant, overhaul of the church roof, installation of a new and expanded kitchen facility in the multifunction Parish Centre and installation of broadband in the church.
