Berwick Parish Church is one of only two churches completed during the

government of Oliver Cromwell. It was built in 1650-52 and is recognised by Pevsner to be "of quite exceptional architectural interest".

Located a short distance from the town centre, it is on an established tourist circuit and receives many visitors.

A warm welcome is extended to all: those who are interested in the history of the building and those who share the faith of the Church.

The facilities in the church building and in the adjacent modern Parish Centre are much used throughout the year, both for regular worship and for a large variety of local activities.




