#### The Fabric Group

The Fabric Group working day will be from 9.00 to 12.00 and will cover clearing gutters, and drains plus several other jobs around the church.

#### **Berwick Parish Church Solar Panel Project**

Approved by the Parish Church Council on 6th November 2023.

30 solar panels to be installed on the southside roof:

- ballasted and clamped to modern, ridged surface
- hidden from public view by the castellated wall
- a 1m service area under the wall for gutter clearing and a 1m service area under the church windows for cleaning
- one cable to be brought down inside the Bell Tower into the locked side room beneath.

2 batteries and inverter to be housed against the south wall in the side room:

- a cupboard to be built in a style appropriate for the church under the window on the south wall
- cabling to be run in the existing modern casing at floor level, around the west wall and under the Gallery stairs into the meter cupboard
- the side room books to be placed in a more accessible area or returned to the side room after the works are completed, according to the wishes of the Library Committee.

Planning permission is now proceeding with referrals to the following:

- Northumberland County Council
- Diocesan Advisory Committee
- Statutory Consultees including Historic England, Church Buildings Council and the National Amenity Societies.

An Ecological Impact Survey has concluded there is negligible risk to bats or nesting birds.

The Church is open daily and you are welcome to sit for a while for a time of prayer or reflection
