Now, I'm not a 'bah humbug' Scrooge, but as my friends well know and comment on frequently, I am an Advent Advocate. I love Christmas, I love the church being full, the carols, the readings, the smell of trees and candles and mince pies. I do. But I also love the waiting to get there!

December isn't Christmas, it's Advent. It's about waiting and anticipating what exactly it means to celebrate the birth of this baby called Jesus at the end of the month. Why is it so important? What are we waiting for? How excited can we be? Advent is the season when we think of all that and we wait.

We are not good at waiting in our 24/7 immediate culture. And this isn't the sitting around, swinging our legs bored kind of waiting, it is an expectant, hopeful waiting, knowing that what we wait for is the baby who changed the world and who can change you and me.

The angel tells Joseph that the baby's name will be Emmanuel, which means God with us. That's what we wait for, for God to be with us as one of us and what that means for each of us as we experience it again.

That's why there is a lot going on this month at Berwick Parish Church, to give you the opportunity to stir up that hopeful waiting. Nine Lessons and Carols on Sunday 21st December at 6:00pm lets us hear the familiar readings and sing the old carols. The Crib Service on Christmas Eve at 5:00pm is a chance for the younger ones amongst us to re-live the wonder of that first Christmas Day. And at Midnight Mass at 11:30pm on Christmas Eve, Christmas proper starts and I relent and wish everyone a very Happy Christmas!

But not everyone will enjoy this season, for any number of reasons and on Saturday 20th December at 3:00pm we have a Quiet Christmas service, with space for some silence, candles and reflecting on what can sometimes be a difficult time of year.

So, I'm not Scrooge, but I would encourage you to take some time this Advent season to wait, to stop and think about what is coming, to enter into the hope of the season, especially at a time when hope seems rare.

The hope of the Christ child, of God with us, that's what we're waiting for.
