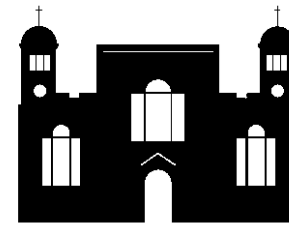
## The Fabric Group

### February 2026

February was never my favourite month if I'm honest. Maybe because my birthday is at the end of March (hint) it felt an unnecessary delay, when nothing really happens. Until I fell in love with the Church's liturgical year, I know, weirdo! Every February 2<sup>nd</sup>, Candlemas, the year turns, away from Christmas and towards Lent and Easter. It mirrors the lengthening days, even if the weather isn't playing ball. There is a sense of renewal and refreshment about this short month that I now enjoy.

This year Lent begins in February, Ash Wednesday is 18<sup>th</sup> February. Thomas Merton called Lent a "Holy Spring," a far cry from the misery we often make it. Rather an opportunity to see where we need to do some weeding and planting in our own lives, to notice the green shoots of growth. In the parish church we have begun preparing for Lent by considering how we can prepare to make Lent a time of growth and change for all of us. We'd be delighted if you wanted to join us in that journey.

Some of that growth and change will be as a result of our second PCC away day at the end of the month, thinking about what the next steps are in becoming the parish God is calling us to be. We've already dreamed some dreams and now we need to think about making them a reality.

One thing we've already decided is very appropriate for February with Valentine's Day around the corner and this month being LGBTQI+ History Month. Given the House of Bishops' decision not to take forward the discussions on how the Church better welcomes LGBTQI+ people fully, our parish has agreed that we will offer prayers of blessing for any same-sex couple who have a civil marriage and would like to be blessed. It might not be the last step, but it is a step, and a sign that as a parish we take seriously the call to be the parish church for everyone. ### Caring for God's Acre: Love Your Yew Trees Week, 9<sup>th</sup> – 15<sup>th</sup> February

The organisers aim to set one achievable task every year. This year's task is 'ground level maintenance', to clear under the canopy and for about 1 metre out. Our yews are not ancient, planted in the millennium year, but they are becoming veteran trees, so need TLC. A large proportion of the country's ancient and veteran yew trees, about 800, are found and preserved in churchyards like ours.

Britain is home to more ancient and veteran yews than almost any other country, so we must do our bit to preserve this ancient species.
